Ordinance Introductions: First reading of Ordinance N9o. 1475 entitled:
AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEASIDE PARK, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 76 ENTITLED "VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC" ARTICLE XII (RESTRICTED PARKING FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS) TO ADDRESS CRITERIA FOR HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Seaside Park, County of Ocean and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 76-55 of the Code of the Borough of Seaside Park entitled, "Location as Designated", is hereby supplemented by the inclusion of the following sub-section:

"A. Criteria. Applicants requesting placement of a restricted handicapped parking space in front of their home or residence shall generally be eligible only if the home or residence is not serviced by a driveway. The Borough Council retains the discretion to grant restricted handicapped parking spaces where the home or residence is serviced by a driveway in appropriate cases where compelling reasons are present".

SECTION 2. This Ordinance repeals any inconsistent ordinance or ordinances or part or parts thereof.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

Ordinance No. 1476 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEASIDE PARK, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 76 ENTITLED “VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC”, ARTICLE II (PROHIBITED PARKING); PROHIBITED STOPPING OR STANDING AND TIME LIMIT OF PARKING (IN ORDER TO ALLOW PARALLEL PARKING ON BOTH SIDES OF OCEAN AVENUE FROM 12TH AVENUE TO 14TH)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Seaside Park, County of Ocean and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 76-3 of the Code of the Borough of Seaside Park entitled, “Parking Prohibited At All Times On Certain Streets”, is hereby amended at Schedule I to delete the portion reading:

<u>“Name of Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Location</u>
Ocean Avenue	Both	From 12 th Avenue to 14 th Avenue”

Public Hearings: Final reading of Ordinance No. 1474 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEASIDE PARK, OCEAN COUNTY, NJ AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 50, ENTITLED “OFFICES AND EMPLOYEES” AND CHAPTER 61 ENTITLED “PERSONNEL”

BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Seaside Park, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 50 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Seaside Park entitled, “Offices and Employees” is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Article III, entitled “Public Works Director”, so as to amend Section 50-7.0 in its entirety as follows:

50-7.0 Position Established.

The position of Public Works Director is hereby established to oversee and control the Department of Public Works and to act as liaison between said department and the Mayor and Borough Council. The position of Public Works Director shall be a part-time position.

Section 2. Chapter 50 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Seaside Park entitled, “Offices and Employees” is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Article VII, entitled “Borough Administrator, so as to amend Section 50-22 in its entirety as follows:

50-22 Position established.

The office of Borough Administrator is hereby created within the Borough of Seaside Park, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey. Said position shall be a part time position.

Section 3. Chapter 61 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Seaside Park is hereby amended and supplemented so as to omit Section 61-2(D)(1)(b) and Section 61-2(E)(1)(b) in their entirety and replace each with the word “reserved”

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of this ordinance inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. If any sections, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed separate,

distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

Comments for Council: Mr. Appleby states his reasons for implementing this ordinance, mainly due to the recession.

Dr. McHugh states he is against this ordinance stating you cannot run a Borough with part time department heads.

Mayor Connors states he is 100% against this ordinance.

Audience: comments made by Sharon Pratico Bucci stating she was perplexed by the introduction of this ordinance.

Nancy Koury 6th Ave. voices strong opposition to this ordinance. DPW cannot be run by part time employees. We need to cut back in the budget to save money, not department head salaries.

Bob Martucci, 10th Avenue: He states Joe Walker should have been promoted to Director. Council states he was asked but refused.

Motion for approval made by Mr. Appleby and seconded by Mr. Meyer.

NAYS: Brennan, McHugh, Jablonski (with several statements as to why he was opposed to how it was introduced without a full Council, and the need for full time department heads.)

Mayor Connors broke the tie with a NAY vote.

Committee Reports:

Adm. Julie Keizer: We did receive the energy audit, will be going out to bidders. The Garden Club applied for a grant and will be using our certificate of liability insurance. We are looking for a grant to study the parking meter issue. No green acres money for O Street, the DEP will not approve the walkway. We will re-bid and see how the bids come in. Will have more information for the next meeting.

Mr. Meyer: There is a meeting scheduled for next Tuesday, 3/3 at 10 AM. The school information was not correct as printed in the Taxpayer’s Assoc. newsletter. A fact sheet will be enclosed with the water bill. It concerns the Toms River School District only and the taxpayers will not have a vote.

Mr. Kelly: We had our first budget meeting last evening. There are two more to follow on 3/3 and 3/11. We had an Administrative Committee Meeting and had excellent reports on the new purchasing system from the CFO. We are looking to change payroll companies; the website is underway.

Mr. Appleby: No meetings this week for beach or the Marina. The budgets are in. Boardwalk reconstruction in the south end is underway. The purchase of a board by residents will be \$50.00 as approved by resolution.

Mr. Brennan: Bids for water and sewer project will be back by 3/9.

Mr. Jablonski: Public Works meeting held Feb. 19th. Next W/S meeting will be to discuss duty assignments with CME and CMX. Railings to be installed on the boardwalk, there are two samples here to view. The committee suggests stainless steel for an increase of \$50,000.00 as it will hold up better in this climate. Mr. Mackie suggests putting the rails on the west side of the ramp only. Engineer will research and submit a report. Mr. Brennan suggests fiberglass pipe, Mr. Peters states that is not as durable. We will further discuss trash collection. NJ launched a program today re: "going green grants" and will have a resolution to apply for the next meeting. Money will be available through the stimulus program in Washington for energy efficiency.

Dr. McHugh: About to begin the water system in a week or two. We are discussing the placement of the community sign. We had a Marina committee meeting last Friday evening to go through the rules and regulations of the Marina ordinance. The slips are filling up.

Adm. Julie Keizer: One more thing had a meeting with the DOT and asked about the light changing schedule. She also asked that the Rt. 35 project move along quickly.

Audience: Jim Miller, 8th Ave. and Seaside Heights: Discusses R2008-78 regarding psychological services. He also has a complaint regarding the Police Dept. which Chief Dickson will address down stairs.

Sharon Bucci, 7th Avenue: She discusses the request from the Fire Co. for turn out gear. We are working on that issue with the Fire Co. chief. She discusses the underage drinking task force of which she was a part of. She applauds the no vote for part time positions for Adm. and DPW Dir. She discusses parking on 12th to 14th Avenues on Ocean Avenue.

Mike Juliano, L Street: He discusses the underage drinking task force ordinance.

Chris McCarrick, 11th Avneue: Discusses the position Carol Kane held last summer and her appointment for 2009. That will be discussed this evening.

Cheryl Raley, N. Ocean Avenue: She discusses Summer in the Park on the website and the repair of the clock tower which will be done before the summer concerts on the front lawn.

Pat Kuchon, S. Ocean Avenue: She discusses lighting on the boardwalk and solar lighting and suggests we do not go cheap. Ocean Ave. has not been swept since Nov. She states Council should work together for the better of the town. She states the boardwalk at the north end by the businesses is extremely dirty. They will be notified to clean up.

Chuck Appleby, 10th Avenue: Suggests we use an architect for the railings and lighting on the boardwalk.

Pat DeGutis, Stockton Avenue: She discusses the website; rails on the boardwalk stating we should use galvanized and adhere to the ADA design; trash on the boardwalk asking Adm. Julie Keizer to write a letter to the businessmen. She would like all the lights on the boardwalk to look the same. She also discusses our school issue. She suggests getting rid of the meters north end of Ocean Avenue.

Faye Haring, I Street: She discusses lighting on the boardwalk and solar energy.
