Alarm- Police responded to the area of E Street and Central Avenue for a burglar alarm activation. Officers arrived and checked the perimeter, and no signs of forced entry were observed. Officers did locate someone on the property, it was determined that they were authorized to be there, and determined the alarm was set off in error.

Fraud- Police were dispatched to the area of 12th and Central Avenue to take a fraud report. Officers arrived and spoke to the caller who stated they responded to a job offer that they received via email that appeared to be legitimate and was from a known company. The caller responded and followed the steps they were instructed to follow. They sent sensitive personal information as well purchased some expensive items they were told were required for the job. They were given a fake check that did not clear for the equipment that they sent payments out for to a fake vendor. The scammer even created a fake email with a similar name of the known company that was subtly misspelled. The caller got concerned when they were no longer getting responses from the point of contact that they had been dealing with. The caller made phone calls to their banks and other institutions to advise them of possible fraud or identity theft. We gathered all the information needed to generate a report for the victim.

Fire Alarm- Police and the Seaside Park Volunteer Fire Company responded to the area of Farragut and Ocean for a fire alarm activation. Officers arrived and no smoke or active fire were observed. The fire department arrived and checked the building with their heat sensing equipment and determined that everything was safe, and that the alarm was set off in error.

Suspicious Person- Police were dispatched to the area of F Street and the Boardwalk for a male who was allegedly throwing snowballs at vehicles as they passed by. Officers arrived and did

locate the male that was described by the caller. The male did admit to throwing snowballs at some vehicles that passed by. No vehicles were struck, and no damage was done. The male was given a verbal warning.

First Aid- Police and Tri-Boro First Aid Squad responded to assist a victim who was unconscious and possibly overdosed. Officers responded and began to assess the patient who was unresponsive. Police assisted the patient by ensuring they were positioned properly to breath and Narcan was also deployed by Officers. EMS arrived and began to work on the patient. They were transported to Community Medical Center for treatment.

Landlord Tenant Dispute- Police were dispatched to the area of 7th and Central Avenue for a landlord tenant dispute. The landlord and tenant were in disagreement over use of facilities on the property. There was nothing in the lease agreement that clarified the issue. Subjects were advised to seek assistance with the landlord tenant court to rectify their problem if they could not do so on their own.

Wires Down- Police and the Seaside Park Volunteer Fire Company responded to a report of a down wire that was causing a road hazard. Officers arrived and assessed the situation and determined it was a cable wire and not a danger at this time. The fire department arrived and safely cut the wire and moved it out of the way. The cable company was notified to make the necessary repairs.
