Ordinance Violation- While on patrol in the area of Stockton Avenue beach Officers observed a male consuming and open container of alcohol. Officers made contact with the male and advised him of the ordinance and prompted him to dispose of his alcoholic beverage. He was also issued a borough summons for the violation.
