Odor Investigation- Police and the Seaside Park Volunteer Fire Company responded to the area of I Street and Central for a caller who believed they smelled natural gas. Officers and the fire company arrived and began to investigate. The fire company used their equipment and did not detect any natural gas present. No further police action required.

First Aid- Police and Tri-Boro First Aid Squad responded to help a patient experiencing general weakness. Officers and EMS arrived and assessed the patient at the scene. They were transported to Community Medical Center for further treatment.

Suspended Driver- While conducting a motor vehicle stop for a traffic violation in the area of L Street and Central. It was determined that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was issued several summonses including driving with a suspended license.

Alarm- Police were dispatched to the area of O Street and Central Avenue for a burglar alarm activation. Officers arrived and checked the residence. No signs of forced entry were observed. The front door was found to be unlocked. The residence was checked, and nothing appeared to be disturbed, and no occupants were found. The homeowner was contacted and advised of our findings.

Fire Alarm- Police and the Seaside Park Volunteer Fire Company responded to area of Stockton and Ocean for a fire alarm activation. Officers arrived and checked the building, and no smoke or fire was observed. The fire department checked the building with their heat sensing equipment and determined that there was no hazard and everything was safe.

Erratic Driver- Police responded to the area of Porter Avenue and Central for a report of a Purple BMW driving at a high rate of speed with their lights off. Officers responded and located the vehicle which had struck the guard rail. The vehicle was being operated by a 17-year-old male and was overloaded with too many passengers. This vehicle had been driving up and down route 35 running from police with their lights off with reported speeds of 100 MPH. The vehicle was towed, and the driver was issued several traffic summonses. Other jurisdictions were issuing the driver for the infractions that occurred in their municipalities.
