Alarm- Police responded to the area of 2nd and Ocean for a burglar alarm activation. Officers arrived and checked the residence, and no signs of forced entry were observed. Community Policing- While on patrol Officers were flagged down by a juvenile female who had been separated from her parents in the area of Stockton Avenue beach. Officers walked with the individual until they were able to locate her family and reunite the parties.
