

10/17

First Aid- Police and Tri-Boro First Aid Squad responded to help a victim who had fallen and sustained an injury to their shoulder. Officers and EMS arrived and assessed the patient at the scene. They were later transported to Community Medical Center for treatment.

10/18

Suspicious Activity- Police were dispatched to the area of 9th and Central Avenue for a caller who observed several different religious symbols etched onto the sidewalk with a stone.
