SEASIDE PARK BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Work Session of the Borough Council of the Borough of Seaside Park was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 11, 2015 in the Borough Council Meeting Room located at Sixth & Central Avenues, Seaside Park.

"In accordance with the requirements of New Jersey's Open Public Meetings Act, public notice of this meeting was included in the required Annual Meeting Notice which was filed in the Office of the Seaside Park Borough Clerk; posted on the Bulletin Board located in the Municipal Building; and forwarded to the Asbury Park Press, the Ocean Star, and to all persons requesting notice and providing self-addressed, postage-paid envelopes."

Roll Call Present: Robert Matthies, Mayor Michael Tierney, Council President Nancy Koury Jean Contessa David Nicola Faith Liguori Gail Coleman Absent: None.

Also Attending: Steven Zabarsky, Borough Attorney Robert Martucci, Borough Administrator Karen Barna, Borough Clerk

Council discussed the request to have the opportunity to house the donation by Stevens Institute to place the resilient "SURE" house on borough property located at N Street and North Ocean Avenue. Ms. Koury explained this solar-powered structure will become a community/education center for children and adults. It will be available for educational purposes for higher educational facilities to use for research such as Ocean County College, Stevens Institue, and Rutgers as well as for local school children. Ms. Koury commented this is a wonderful opportunity as it would be too much of a tax burden for Seaside Park alone to bring this type of structure to our community.

Ms. Liguori felt that other locations in town are more suitable for this structure and should be considered rather than the Ocean Avenue lot. And that the Ocean Avenue lot should go back on our tax rolls. Ms. Coleman concurred with Ms. Liguori's comments that the 14th Avenue bay lot should be considered. Mr. Tierney commented that the Stevens committee considered all borough property and felt the Ocean Avenue lot would be more suited for public visibility. He further commented the Ocean Avenue lot just completed a two year use as a sand sculpture museum that brought a lot of foot traffic and felt it was a positive tourism draw for our community after the 2012 storm. Ms. Contessa explained the municipal tax for the Ocean Avenue lot is \$3500 of which the borough is exempt.

Mayor Matthies commented if there are any restrictions the borough should be aware of with regards to ownership. Mr. Zabarsky noted the building title can be made a condition of the contract. *Public Comments*

Pat DeGutis Stockton Avenue, inquired whether the site was chosen to be visible for the public as it is an odd location to use for environmental experiments. Ms. Contessa explained its main purpose of the structure is to sustain storm impact and for protection from the elements.

Marybeth Gorman, N Street, wondered the council's expectations if the structure fails. Mr. Tierney noted it will continue as a community building for borough activities.

Motion for approval to use the borough owned Ocean Avenue lot to house the SIT SURE structure was made by Mr. Tierney seconded by Ms. Koury. For: Mr. Tierney, Ms. Koury, Ms. Contessa, Mr. Nicola.

Against: Ms. Coleman, Ms. Liguori. MOTION CARRIED.

Council reviewed the completed 2014 audit report. Mr. Tierney felt it is a good report. It reflects the continuing to work on paying down our debt. Mayor Matthies acknowledged council for their hard work to keep the borough in good financial shape. Ms. Coleman noted we are one of few towns to have completed the FEMA audit.

The Council reviewed whether the annual arts and craft show should be relocated to the marina lawn. Ms. Koury felt the marina lawn should be considered as there is an opportunity to enhance and grow the show as it is a larger site. Ms. Coleman stated it is tradition and should remain at the police department lawn as it is important for local businesses in this area as it brings in a lot of people. Ms. Liguori concurred with Ms. Coleman. Mayor Matthies felt it should remain at its present location for now due to the effect of Route 35 reconstruction on local businesses and perhaps be considered a move next year.

Ms. Liguori reviewed a draft volunteer application for council's consideration. Mr. Zabarsky offered to send it to our insurance agent for further review of whether a volunteer will be covered through our borough insurance.

Mr. Nicola announced his intent to resign his council seat due to family issues. He will make himself available to the public and hopes to tie up any loose ends. His date will be effective as of July 3rd.

Mayor Matthies thanked Mr. Nicola for his hard work and service to our borough.

Public Comments

Al Vassallo, Central Avenue, inquired of the borough requesting permission to use our local school building for events and activities. Ms. Coleman explained the building and property does not belong to the borough.

Bill Wilson, 7th and Bayview Avenue, inquired that it seems every crosswalk has been marked except for 7th Avenue. Mayor Matthies agreed noting no crosswalk was completed at 14th Avenue also. He further commented he previously made the request in writing and is awaiting a response from NJDOT. Mr. Wilson also commented the 8th Avenue pump station has protruding 4 ft. pipes that should be made safe to protect curious children. Mayor Matthies felt it is a reasonable suggestion and will bring it to the managing engineer.

Public comment session was closed.
