The Work Session of the Borough Council of the Borough of Seaside Park was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 13, 2015 in the Borough Council Meeting Room located at Sixth & Central Avenues, Seaside Park. Mayor Matthies recognized the passing of Seaside Park resident June DeVellis.

Mayor Matthies introduced owner of the Park Pavilion who was present to review the pending ABC renewal license for 2016. Mr. D'Onofrio explained many of the existing conditions are no longer relevant due to the reconstruction and the use of the second floor as a banquet facility. Chief Larkin reviewed current resolution conditions for the second floor and remarked some are typical of conditions that apply to each one of our municipality's ABC license holders. Based on council's remarks and suggestions, Mr. Zabarsky will present a draft resolution at the next meeting. Council reviewed a recommendation from the Planning Board to amend the 2013 Flood Hazard Damage Data". Ms. Koury explained comments are from NJDEP that reflect final flood maps issued in 2015 and are now required for each town.

Council reviewed the application permit that is part of the pending ordinance for beach bon fires. Chief Larkin reviewed the draft to amend traffic regulations to comply with NJDOT's traffic regulations with regards to parking time limits along Route 35/Central Avenue. The Operations Committee will review the amendments and report findings to mayor and council members. Ms.Coleman updated council on a report received from Berkeley Township with regards to renewal of the pending shared fire protection agreement. Council agreed to the terms and conditions as presented along with annual payment and offer to fund a new vehicle. Ms. Coleman plans to enter into talks with Berkeley Township and Seaside Heights in order to secure a new vehicle also for the Tri-Boro First Aid Squad.

Ms. Coleman spoke of the meeting held in Lavallette that she and Mayor Matthies attended and addressed the joint senate/assembly committee concerning DOT's environmental issues.

Council reviewed a draft for a volunteer service application. Ms. Liguori commented she hoped this will not interfere with ability to volunteer for Tri-Boro or the fire department. Ms. Liguori requested a copy of the application be added to the borough's website. Mr. Zabarsky noted we can add a 'gap' insurance policy as additional protection for the borough.

Mr. Martucci provided an update on the installation of Wi-Fi along the ocean front beach. Plans to go 'live' and to host a ribbon cutting will be announced soon.

Mr. Martucci also updated mayor and council with regards to the pending bay shore grant. He will be traveling to Trenton for the next round of talks.

Ms. Coleman presented a verbal request for a roadway memorial for Sgt. Lyons who was killed in action. Ms. Koury noted a formal request should be submitted in accordance with our memorial policy that is now in place.

Council reviewed the resolution for the settlement of the Public Workers Union contract. Mr. Zabarsky noted this is appropriate action as the memorandum of agreement has been signed by both parties.

Council reviewed correspondence from the Seaside Park Environmental Committee endorsing a digital sign board and requested that council again look into acquiring one. Ms. Koury noted former Councilman Nicola researched it and brought the information to council. Ms. Koury is in favor of it and will bring it back to the Operations Committee for additional review.

Council reviewed the request for approval of the bill list.
