The Work Session of the Borough Council of the Borough of Seaside Park was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on April 10, 2014 in the Borough Council Meeting Room located at Sixth & Central Avenues, Seaside Park.

Borough Administrator Martucci updated council members with the overall proposal to expand wifi over the ocean beach property. Currently it is utilized on a trial basis on our northerly beaches and hopes to extend it to our marina property also. Curtis Kleier presented a proposed plan outlining the areas. Mr. Kleier explained it will cross over Ocean Avenue and be available to western Ocean Avenue properties. The proposed plan will be in two phases. He felt there many benefits to this plan along with possible future grants. Councilman Tierney reported on the proposal to re-appoint our engineering firm as Flood Plain manager for a \$37,500 cost. He explained that the initial cost was higher due to the amount of claims after Sandy. Mr. Martucci reported the emergency berm is scheduled to be relocated from Funtown Pier as they are preparing to rebuild the boardwalk. Councilwoman Koury updated council members on re-introducing the property maintenance code explaining the 2012 International Property Maintenance Code book brings us into compliance and will fit in the new computer software. Ms. Koury also explained the re-introduction for the inspection process pertains to re-inspection process requiring licensing and permits to be current with taxes and utilities and that code violation fees were previously established by the court setting a minimum fine.

The Council reviewed the following requests for resolutions:

- Authorizing a post-Sandy planning assistance grant.
- Appointing seasonal employees to the Beach Control Department.
- Proclaiming National Library Week.

The Council reviewed and approved the following "Use of Boro Facilities" requests.

- Annual softball game.
- Annual walkathon from the Ocean Running Club.
- Annual PTA Fish Hat parade.
- Hometown Heros "Bands in the Sand" fundraising event.
- Annual children's fishing tournament.


Public Comments
