



Residents, renters, visitors, contractors and businesses in Seaside Park are required to recycle. The items listed below **must** be separated from your regular garbage for curbside collection. Failure to separate these items will result in your garbage not being collected and is subject to issuance of a summons. Recycling saves Seaside Park tens of thousands of dollars every year in avoided landfill disposal fees, saves valuable resources and is the right thing to do! IT'S ALSO THE LAW - NOT AN OPTION. Please remember—recycling can be different in other towns. Items recyclable in one town may not be recyclable in another. Per the Code of the Borough of Seaside Park Chapter 390

GARBAGE CANS MUST NOT EXCEED 45 GALLONS IN CAPACITY OR 50 lbs IN WEIGHT WHEN FILLED; ROBO-CANS or ROLL-OUT CANS ARE NOT PERMITTED
Please place your garbage or recycling between the curb and sidewalk by 7AM on the day of your pickup but not prior to 6pm on the day before.

CURBSIDE SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING—ALL IN ONE CONTAINER!!

Newspaper, Mixed Paper, Corrugated Cardboard, Bottles, Cans & Plastic Containers*

All newspaper, corrugated cardboard, mixed paper, junk mail, bottles, cans & plastic containers* **must be placed loose in a container** with handles and a lid, not to exceed 32 gallons in size and a maximum weight of 50 lbs. when filled, per Borough Code—Chapter 390. **DO NOT PLACE YOUR RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS FOR PICKUP! DO NOT TIE OR TAPE MATERIALS TOGETHER!** They will be tagged and not picked up until they are placed loose in the proper container.

YES—Recycle These In Your Single Stream Container!

- Junk mail, corrugated cardboard, newspapers with inserts
- Magazines, computer paper, office paper, empty brown bags
- School papers, shredded paper, envelopes, etc.
- Soda, milk, water, beer, juice, shampoo, conditioner, bleach
- Empty non-hazardous aerosol cans, soup and pet food cans
- Detergent, fabric softener, lotions
- *Plastic containers with a neck smaller than the body of the container

NO—Do Not Recycle These In Your Single Stream Container!

- **NO PLASTIC BAGS! NO STRING!**
- NO gray chipboard boxes, cereal boxes, pizza boxes, six pack boxes
- NO wax coated, or frozen food boxes, pie plates, bakery plastics
- NO clam shell type containers, paper plates, plastic food trays, ceramics
- NO trash, caps, wraps, light bulbs, fish tanks, yogurt, peanut butter jars
- NO solvents, paint cans, adhesives, oil, antifreeze or pesticide containers
- NO garden plastics, flower pots, coat hangers, toys, styrofoam, hoses
- NO mirrors, windows, buckets, pails, aluminum/vinyl siding

BATTERIES—Automotive and rechargeable batteries only of all sizes should be taken to the Recycling Center and placed in the proper container located in the “Environmental Drop-Off Shed.” All alkaline batteries such as AA, AAA, C, D, 9V and 6V may be thrown out with your regular trash. They are no longer recycled. Batteries containing Lithium such as watch and hearing aid batteries should be held for Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Events held by the Ocean County Department of Solid Waste Management. Call 732-506-5047 for details.

BRUSH, TREE LIMBS, CHRISTMAS TREES—brush should be cut & tied in bundles not more than three (3) feet long or fifty (50) lbs in weight, and placed at the curb next to your regular garbage. It will be collected separately after your trash collection. No stumps or brush with a diameter greater than 4 inches. Christmas trees will be picked up after your garbage in January. They are also accepted at the Recycling Center during January only. **Please do not bring brush to the recycling center.**

BULK TRASH—Items such as appliances, bikes, TV's (20"+), carpets, furniture, tires, small amounts of concrete, stumps and other large items can only be collected if the required \$10.00 per item fee is paid in advance and a “BULK TRASH PERMIT” is attached. Permits can be purchased at the Construction Department located at the 4th Avenue side of the Seaside Park School, Monday - Friday, 8AM to 4PM. Bulk trash items will be collected town wide on Tuesdays during the winter collection schedule and on Thursdays during the summer collection schedule. Please see the calendar on reverse side.

CFL LIGHTBULBS (compact fluorescent lights) - Please bring unbroken CFL bulbs to your nearest Home Depot. Four to eight foot fluorescent lamps may be brought to the Ocean County Recycling Center on New Hampshire Ave. in Lakewood, NJ. Call 732-506-5047 for details. **Do not bring them to the Seaside Park Recycling Center.**

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS—The removal of construction, demolition, or remodeling debris is the responsibility of the contractor or property owner and will not be collected by the Borough. **Do not bring construction debris to the Recycling Center.**

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT - Computers, monitors, televisions under 20”, VCR's, printers, radios, laptops, telephones can all be brought to the Recycling Center and placed in the designated area. Or, call the Public Works Department at 732-793-5100 to schedule a FREE pickup. By law—TV's, computers, and computer monitors CANNOT be placed in your regular garbage.

GRASS CLIPPINGS— Those with lawns are encouraged to “Cut it and Leave It.” Grass clippings are a natural fertilizer and leaving them on the lawn can save you time and money, and can give you a better looking lawn. Otherwise, please dispose with your regular trash.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE—including stains, wood preservative, solvents, items containing mercury, pool chemicals and pesticides should be held for an Ocean County sponsored Household Hazardous Waste collection event. These items cannot be collected with your regular garbage and cannot be accepted at the Recycling Center. For more information on the Household Hazardous Waste collection schedule call the Ocean County Department of Solid Waste Management at 732-506-5047. **DO NOT BRING THESE ITEMS TO THE RECYCLING YARD OR PUBLIC WORKS!**

LEAVES— Please call the Public Works Department to schedule a FREE pickup of bagged leaves. We encourage you to compost your leaves for mulch. Information about backyard composting is available upon request. **Please, no grass clippings or other vegetative waste.**

MOTOR OIL, OIL FILTERS & ANTIFREEZE—can be brought to the Recycling Center in capped containers only (gallon or half gallon detergent bottles work well). Please place these containers and oil filters in the “Environmental Drop-Off Shed” **DO NOT DUMP OIL OR ANTIFREEZE IN THE SHED—LEAVE IN THE CONTAINER PLEASE!!** Used motor oil can also be taken to service stations displaying a “USED OIL RECYCLING” sign.

PAINT CANS—(FULL & EMPTY) - Residents of Ocean County may drop off unused paint and empty paint cans at the Public Works Department building from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday ONLY. You must check in at the front office to register before dropping off paint. Paint will not be accepted from businesses such as paint contractors. This program is for latex, oil, and boat paint only. **NO** stains, wood preservatives or any other hazardous waste. **DO NOT BRING PAINT OR PAINT CANS TO THE RECYCLING YARD!** No other materials are accepted. Paint only!

RIGID PLASTICS— The Ocean County Northern and Southern Recycling Centers are accepting rigid plastics such as buckets, plastic toys, milk crates, lawn furniture, etc. For a complete list please visit their website at <http://www.co.ocean.nj.us/SolidWaste>. Seaside Park will also accept these items at Public Works. Please call 732-793-5100 to schedule a pickup or drop off of select rigid plastics.

TELEPHONE BOOKS—should be taken to the Recycling Center and placed in the blue barrel labeled “Phone Books”.

SMOKE DETECTORS— please contact the manufacturer of the smoke detector for proper recycling. Do not bring them to the recycling yard or DPW!

WEEDS & OTHER YARD WASTE - should be disposed of with your regular garbage.
