Proof of Valid Rabies Vaccination State law requires that your dog's rabies does NOT expire prior to NOV. 1st of the current licensing. If your dog's rabies vaccination expires any time between January and October 31, 2020, the dog must be re-vaccinated before a license can be issued (or) a letter of exemption from the veterinarian is provided. New Jersey State law does not allow us to waive any vaccination deadlines.

The owner of any newly-acquired dog of licensing age or of any dog which attains licensing age shall make an application for a license and registration tag for such dog within ten days after such acquisition or age attainment.

# PET WASTE AND WATER POLLUTION



The Borough of Seaside Park has adopted and enforces an ordinance that requires immediate and proper disposal of solid pet waste deposited on any property not owned or possessed by the pet owner or keeper. <https://ecode360.com/15461250>

Pet waste is carried by rain, melting snow, and ice to storm drains that empty into rivers, lakes, and the ocean. It also reaches reservoirs which supply much of the drinking water in New Jersey.

Pollution due to pet waste negatively impacts swimming, boating and fishing in these water bodies.

Pet waste contains microorganisms that can cause bacterial diseases, roundworms and parasitic infections.

In addition, pet waste contains harmful levels of nutrients which promote excessive algae and plant growth. This can rob the waterbody of oxygen, potentially killing all aquatic life in the area. Such nutrient pollution also causes waters to become cloudy and green.

## Proper Pet Waste Disposal

**Flush it down the  
toilet.**

*\*But do not flush bags, debris, or non-biodegradable items\**
