Dean's parents met on the Seaside Park boardwalk in 1934, and later Dean would meet his future wife, Amy Gallagher Eberling on that same boardwalk, while working at Funtown Pier. Dean loved fishing, boating, waterskiing, and cycling. In 1989, Dean, his wife Amy, and their 2 children, Corinne and Lauren, purchased their home on G Street. Yet, it remained Dean's dream to purchase the family home on Bayview Avenue. In 1997, Dean was able to realize his dream when he finally purchased the family home. Dean worked as a security analyst for Keef, Bruyette, & Woods in the World Trade Center South Tower on the 89th Floor on September 11, 2001.

Thomas M. Regan III

Thomas was born in Brooklyn, NY and raised in Old Bridge, NJ. Thomas was the only son of Thomas and Shirley, and brother to Donna, Mary Ann, and Kate. Thomas grew up playing football and performing in the local theater. In 1992, Thomas married Gayle, and in 1999 became a father to twins, Allai and Connor. Thomas was a proud father and husband whose family was his whole focus in life. Thomas spent his summers here with family on the beach and boardwalk. Thomas earned his Executive MBA from Columbia University. Thomas worked at Aon Corporation as Managing Director and Sector Leader of the Pharmaceutical and Chemical Division in the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

Robert F. DeVellis

Robert was employed as a commodities broker at the World Trade Center for many years. After experiencing the first bombing at the World trade Center, he moved with his family to Seaside Park to live full-time at 16 First Avenue. On September 11, 2001, he escaped from the 8th floor of the north tower. He suffered a heart attack from which he never recovered. He died on January 10, 2002. He leaves behind his wife June, and two daughters, Dana and Debbie, along with their husbands. His daughter, Debbie Krayesky, was a long-time employee of the Seaside Park Police Department.
